GENERAL MAINTENANCE

- Regular brushing with a pet brush or similar and shaking will assist in retaining the true characteristics of this finish.
- Professional specialist cleaning recommended
- Spot clean stains as soon as possible using a damp sponge and mild detergent, and pat gently with a soft towel to absorb the water.

SHEEPSKIN

Sheepskins are one of nature's greatest insulators, adding texture and warmth with their sumptuous, lush deep pile. Timothy Oulton uses premium sheepskin hides from New Zealand that are naturally soft, luxurious and durable.

SHEEPSKIN UPHOLSTERY

- On short-haired Baa Baa sheepskin: Regular brushing with a pet brush or similar helps retain the soft, fluffy appearance and feel of the sheepskin.
- On long-haired Yeti sheepskin: Do not brush the sheepskin as this may cause the wool to frizz.
- Spot clean stains as soon as possible using a damp sponge and mild detergent, pat gently with a soft towel to absorb the water.
- Don't use any detergents containing bleach or enzymes.
